So focused on getting Jerry back who at the end of our walk decided to chase seagulls for miles along waters edge I forgot about the tide. Finally get to him to find I'm trapped and surrounded by incoming tide. Dogs had to swim and I waded but couldn't reach shore added to that I ended up having a asthma attack with no inhaler on me. Coast guard operative stayed on the phone with me as let's say I was panicking by this time and breathing all shot. RNLI arrived and had inhaler on board and oxygen tank so I came round quickly. Heart rate monitored and they stayed with me till I stabilised again. Land coast guard took over from there to get me back. Still shook up but wow what a service they do. I already give to the cause but please my friends and family please support them if you are happy to see me alive!

All now had baths and resting!

Lifeboats News Release

Monday 13 September 2021

The lifeboat crew were paged at 1.34 pm on 13 September 2021 by the UK Coastguard co-ordinating centre at Holyhead, after a lady walking her dogs saw them swim out to sea, and she ended up on a sandbank, which was diminishing with the incoming tide.

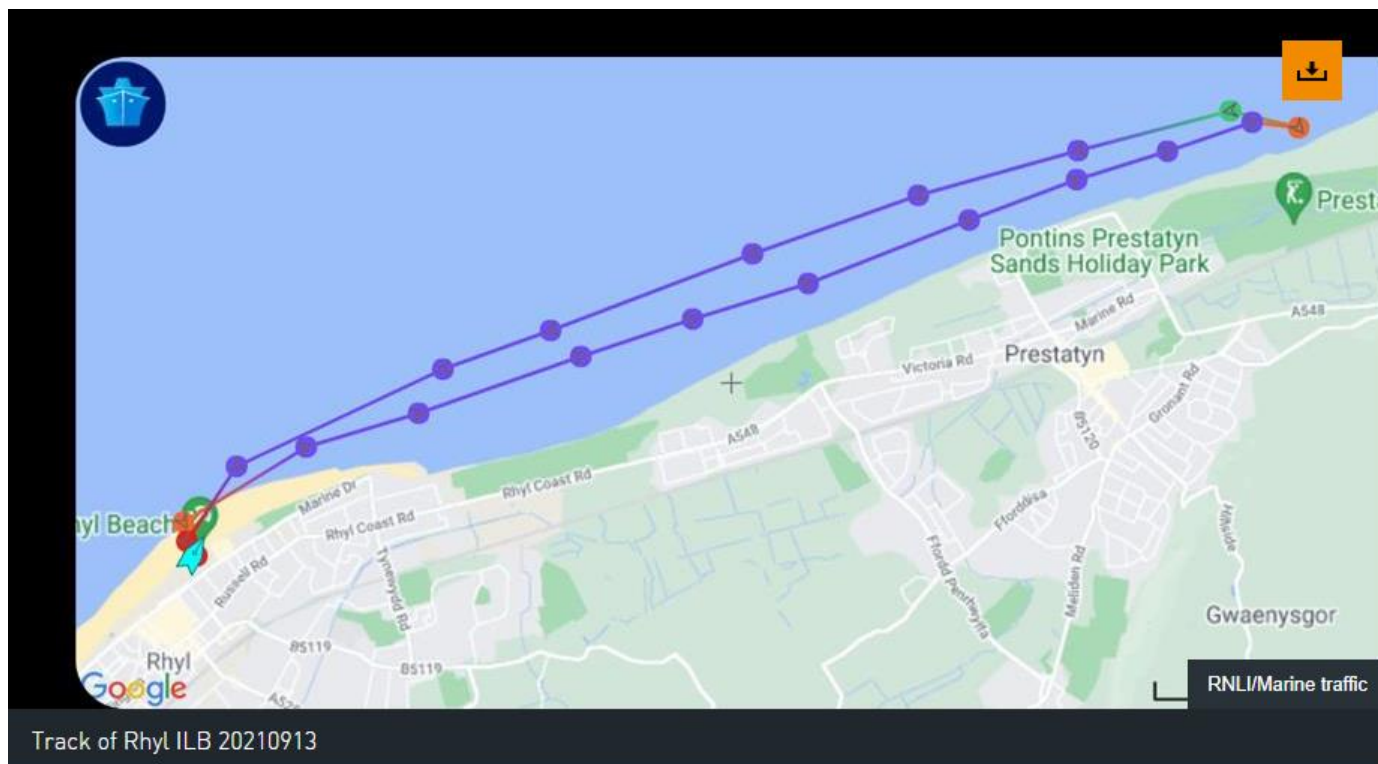

The lady rang 999 to alert the coastguard of her difficulty. The inshore lifeboat crew launched within eight minutes of being tasked, and were on scene some 14 minutes later. The lady was now out of the water on the rocks, and the dogs had just come ashore to be reunited with their owner.

Crew members met up with the lady, who suffered with asthma, and was worried that with her exertions, she would have an attack, and she did not have her inhaler with her.

The crew used their casualty care techniques to administer first aid with the inhaler stored on the boat, and this alleviated the symptoms.

By this time, Volunteer coastguards from Flint had arrived nearby and so the crew escorted the lady and her dogs to the coastguards, who gave her safety advice about the incoming tide.

Vinny Jones, helm of the inshore lifeboat said ' If your dogs run into the sea, please do not follow them. This lady rightly rang 999, and asked for the coastguard who in turn called the lifeboat and coastguards out to assist. Luckily, once the lady left the sea, the dogs turned round and swam ashore'
